PAYMENTS AND CHARGE POLICY: All students are eligible to receive a meal a breakfast and lunch at no charge. No a la carte items may be charged. Adults must pay for meals at time of service. There are no provisions for adult charges.

Offer vs. Serve – Lunch: Offer all 5 components and students must select 3 components with at least 1/2 cup of fruit, vegetable or 100% fruit/vegetable juice to be a reimbursable meal. Students are welcome to take 4 or all 5 components.

Breakfast: Offer 4 food items in 3 components (grains, fruit and milk). Students must select 3 food items with at least 1/2 cup fruit or 100% fruit juice.
